



## Broomstick Lace Scarf with YouTube Help Video

*“Broomstick Lace is also known as Jiffy Lace, Peacock Stitch and Peruvian Stitch.”*

### Materials

- **Yarn:** Approx. 160 yards of worsted weight wool yarn to make the example scarf. Feel free to use more yarn to make the scarf longer, or use a different weight and material such as a cotton sport weight for a light summer scarf.
- **Crochet hook:** size K.
- **Knitting needle:** Preferably one Size 35 knitting needle. Depending upon the size you want the hole and lace effect to be, you can adjust upwards to make larger lace (larger needle – size 50) or downwards to make smaller lace (smaller needle – size 19). You can also substitute a real broomstick lace needle if desired. If you cannot find any of the above, feel free to use the end of a broomstick or broom stick-type object, as they did a century ago!
- Gauge is not necessarily important.

### Abbreviations:

ch = chain  
sc = single crochet  
yo = yarn over

**Start:** Ch 20.

**Row 1:** Pull up the first loop and insert the knitting needle. \*Insert hook into the next ch, yo, pull up a loop and place on knitting needle.\* Repeat from \* to \* for the remaining chains. Total - 20 loops on knitting needle.

**Row 2:** Insert crochet hook through first 5 loops, yo, pull yarn through, then ch 1. (Note – this ch 1 does not count as a sc – it is only used for reinforcement for the first set of loops in each row.) Pull these 5 loops off of knitting needle. Do 5 sc in the center of the loops. \*Insert hook in the next 5 loops and pull these 5 loops off of the knitting needle. Do 5 sc in the center of the loops.\* Repeat from \* to \* until there are no more loops on your knitting needle.

**Row 3:** Draw up a loop with the crochet hook and place this loop on the knitting needle. \*Insert hook in the back loop of the next sc, yo, draw up a loop, place loop on knitting needle.\* Repeat from \* to \* until there are 20 loops on the knitting needle.

**Row 4:** Repeat Row 2.

**Row 5:** Repeat Row 3.

**Row 6+:** Continue alternating between rows 2 and 3 until you are satisfied with the length of the scarf. End with Row 2. Fasten off.
